Status Change to Four Year Degree Granting Institution:

Dixie State College of Utah began offering baccalaureate degrees in a few programs in the Fall of 2000 to students who had already obtained an associate degree. Fall 2006 was the first year freshmen could be admitted directly into a baccalaureate degree seeking program. The four through six year graduation rates above reflect entering full-time, first-time freshmen who completed their associate degree and went on to obtain their baccalaureate degree within 150% of the time of a six year degree.

Who is included:

Only students who were enrolled fall semester as full-time, first-time degree-seeking undergraduates with no prior postsecondary experience are tracked and counted in these rates. This includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior summer term, and students who received advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school). Adjustments are made to exclude those who left the institution because of permanent disability, are deceased, left on a church mission, or left for active duty in the military. Students who transfer into the institution are not included in these graduation rates.
