This is difficult for those of us who live 20 minutes away and work full time. Many friends and co-workers recommend going to SUU or mohave community college over Dixie. The sole reason I am hoping to stick it out with Dixie is because it is the closest to my house. If the others were closer I'd switch without batting an eyelash. Dixie has a lot of work to do to make their classes less of a joke. There's a lot of hoop jumping and games we students have to play to pull off good grades. 1	The main problems I have encountered while attending Dixie have been the overly zealous faculty. I understand that they are merely trying to help, but sometimes it is a little too presumptuous (i.e. speaking with failing students with the thought that they are failing due to the lack of understanding the subject(s), subconsciously expecting everyone to be of L.D.S. or Christian mind (though this is standard being that we abide within Utah), multiple faculty attempting to help the same student (all on the same issue but at different occasions) due to a lack of communication and organization, et al.) I have also had a few problems with registration, with-drawls, class changes and payment; all of which were handled by friendly staff and fixed in time. All in all, I enjoy the teachers and classes, wish we had a wider variety of subjects (though I understand that is partly due to lack of funding at the moment), and am mainly being hindered by "supportive" people (who were kind enough to eventually listen to me and begin supporting me in a way that benefits us both). They need to have information available to them and have the training to be able to answer my questions rather than sending me on a goose chase until I find someone who is willing to spend a few minutes to help me out.
