CURRICULUM

POLICY — Intensive preparation on the 2010–2011 topic. Lectures focus on the topic, contemporary theory, unique and rival views of positions, “cutting edge” argumentation, and a wide set of possible strategies. Labs focus on research, document-mapping, briefing, technique, clarity, rebuttal reworks, refutation and practice.

LD — Lectures focus on philosophy, values, criteria development and upcoming topics. Labs focus on affirmative and negative case construction, delivery, research and practice.

PUBLIC FORUM — Lectures focus on current events, rhetorical strategies, topic approaches, economic, political and social philosophy. Labs focus on conversational discourse, clash, crossfire techniques, persuasion, organization, research and practice.

IE — Lectures and practice for all NFL events.

RESEARCH FACILITIES

Dixie State College features a “state of the art” computer lab. SCFI views technology as a key to learning and debating.
